

Jonathan: More than a tortoise

Since the announcement of Jonathan's birthday international press has exploded around the world. Never has one being done more for St Helena in the short space of a weekend than our Jonathan. CNN, USA Today, BBC and BBC breakfast, ABC including the Guardian newspaper and German press have jumped onto the coverage with CBS news joining in on Monday. Jonathan's fame and mass appeal even outweighed Napoleon as this weekend he went viral. How is this possible you may ask? Maybe it's because Jonathan has enjoyed a certain immortality that we all long for, that cosmetic companies would kill for, that scientists and medical stand in awe of. Or maybe it's about how we approach life as American musician Christopher Tait said after writing and recording a song about Jonathan, he said "Reading about Jonathan's perseverance helped me move forward, embrace change, and see that the world is infinitely bigger than I can possibly imagine" Or just maybe Jonathan's own mantra of living life as laid back as possible and not making too much of a fuss leaves us envious of a life that we all crave.

Whatever you may think, he is a special animal hitting rock star status at the weekend, right up there with Jimmy Hendrix, Jonathan is also the face or rather the flipside of our five pence coin, in addition a series of commemorative stamps were unveiled to mark his 190th birthday.

On St Helena plans were afoot some months ago led by the St Helena government's head of marketing, Emma Weaver and St Helena tourism. "The idea was celebrating Jonathan locally, putting spend into the local community to the private sector keeping the money on island for these activities and for the celebration which seems right to me and then through that we've got amazing exposure for St Helena. Jonathan is such an incredible creature, when we were choosing winners for the art completion we could see how deeply connected St Helena is to Jonathan as our national treasure" Emma told Saint FM.

Plans for Jonathan's birthday party included bringing the community from across the island together at Plantation House in a three day long celebration which included a birthday cake for Jonathan and a cake for humans too. On Saturday a live stream link-up was in place at the paddocks, Jonathan's home that he shares with other tortoises. The live stream provided an interactive opportunity for the island's media and invited guests to share their personal memories of Jonathan plus a rare chance to get up close and personal. Well, when it was my turn to speak, Jonathan seemed far more interested in my bag and its' contents and 'chased' me around a bit, obviously a camera and a recorder are hardly edible delights, Jonathan expressed his disgust with a loud harrumph and pulled his head back in.

Governor Nigel Phillips also voiced delight at being a part of the celebrations, "I think it's the fact that the world's media has shown such interest in Jonathan which gives you the sense of what an incredible thing it is to have the world's oldest tortoise but on top of that he is placing St Helena on the map, there's so much more to St Helena but the tortoise gives you that way in. It's just fantastic that on our front lawn, for the period we have the privilege of being here we have these incredible animals and you feel a real responsibility to look after them and make sure they're cared for. It's team effort, Joe Hollins who has been working with him for such a long time, the Plantation House team and the work they do to keep the paddocks in the right shape for them, your listeners will know there are circles of grass that are allowed to grow a little longer because the animals prefer to eat there" He added with a chuckle "As Governor you have this handover brief which didn't exactly mention the tortoises but as soon as you arrive you become aware of them and very quickly you realize how fantastic it all is"

Jonathan's birthday bash came to an end at the Christmas Fair on Sunday, other highlights included an animated video about his life created by Mikhail Harris. All of those who attended the celebrations were recipients of a special edition certificate, 500 hundred of which had been individually signed by Governor Philips. The certificate holds the first ever image of his footprint

Describing Jonathan's charm first lady Emma Phillips said "On days when it's a bit busy and you're stuck inside doing paperwork and you just need some fresh air, he's a great chap to come and talk to, little easier walking him than walking the dog, he makes you feel good"

There are now plans for a public holiday later this year and already an application is underway to make a national holiday in honour of Jonathan.

Throughout his life time he has watched more than 30 Governors come and go and I bet if he could talk he would have a few tales to tell, he has seen the human race transition from one extreme end of the spectrum to another, from riding horses to arriving on the moon.

Vet Joe Hollins tells everyone that Jonathan's interest remains the same, "sleeping, eating and mating". In a world that seems to have gone mad, Jonathan's ethos of only doing what is absolutely necessary seems all the advice we'll ever need.

Meet My Brother, Jonathan



I mentioned to someone in the Castle that the news coming from SHG this week was, well, a bit lightweight. There's been announcements for road closure and a beach closure plus another national day for something or other. The situation changed a bit at 3:30pm yesterday afternoon when a press release announced a Drug amendment Bill will be presented to Legislative Council. The Bill "proposes amending legislation to allow for the import, sale and supply of cannabis hemp and cannabidiol (CBD) products with THC levels of no more than 0.2% in St Helena." The next bit of the explanation is unexpected, to me anyway. "Allowing the import etc of cannabis hemp means "this will allow people to purchase goods such as clothing and personal care items which may have such levels in them, but are currently illegal in St Helena."

However, if you do not want to cannabis as a hat or face mask the next bit in the announcement may eventually lead to some easing of any aches and pains you may have. "It is proposed that an exemption regulation be created which would take certain products out from the main drugs control regime. This would apply to products with a negligible or ineffective THC level, permitting such products to be lawfully to imported, sold and possessed in St Helena." After saying it will not be possible to get a 'high' from these products the press release states such products will only be sold to people aged 18 years and over. Why? Is the first word that came to my mind. Unfortunately SHG press releases don't often answer questions beginning with 'why'.

You can complain about the cost of living as much as you like, and rightly so. Some new statistics from the Economist Intelligence Unit tells us the title of most expensive place in the world is jointly held by Singapore and New York. Best not to go there. In the United States, Los Angeles and San Francisco are also in the global top ten for places that will empty your purse fastest. Switzerland appears twice in this top ten – its best to give Zurich and Geneva a wide berth. Tel Aviv, Hong Kong. Paris, Copenhagen and Sydney complete the list. The cheapest places to take a holiday are in Syria, Libya and Iran and that is probably because nobody in their right mind would want to go anywhere near those places at the moment. Tunis is among the bottom ten, meaning price inflation has not shot up as much there as most other places. Tunisia had 2 million tourists in 2020 when Covid was gathering speed as it spread around the world. Before Covid Tunisia would attract between 7 and 9 million tourist in a year. Moscow and St Petersburg are the biggest movers up the ranking on the past year while Stockholm and Luxembourg are the two cities which have dropped down the ranking most. Manchester is in that group too, having dropped 12 places in the last 12 months. And finally, just be thankful you do not live in Venezuela where the inflation rate is 132%

The main reason prices have increased so much is ofcourse the price of oil (not CBD oil) which has increased by a global

average of 22%. Now it's not exactly funny I should mention that because the UK fuel price watchdog issued a report this week which says, in a nutshell, oil prices at the pumps rise very quickly when the market price start to rise but when the market price of oil drops, the price at the pumps falls more slowly. This is describing a global situation, not what happens in St Helena. The Royal Automobile Club joined in by saying "Yeah, too right" or words to that effect. The RAC said the same thing happened in 2018, 2019 and 2020. In a nutshell, it happens all the time. An RAC spokesman said, "When wholesale prices trend down for weeks at a time drivers should see pump prices do the same at a similar rate - unfortunately our data shows that this is not often the case." He added, "Wholesale diesel has "plummeted" 33p since the beginning of October, but pump prices have only fallen 8.4p. Meanwhile, the wholesale price of petrol has fallen from 130p a litre to 109p - a drop of 21p, he said. But the average price of unleaded petrol has only fallen 8p." For oil companies life is not worth living unless they are ripping you off.

This is part of the reason why we who have had our children are to those that follow behind us a world which is a much worse state than when we arrived here – bawling our heads off. It is not only the many and varied threats and insecurities of climate change, it is also other important and very necessary considerations such as how old will I be before I can buy a house? "Those in younger age groups are much less likely to be living in their own home by their thirties than their parents. This has significantly restricted younger people's prospects for future social mobility" says a research economist. The kids we leave behind could be just a few years from getting their pension before they can afford to have a place of their own.

But that's not all. Income inequality is still a big issue. And there is wealth as well as income. If you own your own house you have some wealth and the value of that wealth increases as price of everything goes up. Property values can increase faster than the prices of other things. One example is, since 1995, average house prices in the UK have risen from £56,000 to over £290,000 by August 2022. This huge growth has far outpaced general price inflation. But, a sizeable minority of the UK population do not own property or other assets and have no wealth at all. Since the mid 1990s, average earnings (adjusted for inflation) grew by around 37%, while average house prices grew by 188%, meaning they almost tripled in value. These are UK statistic again; I don't think St Helena statistics will show this kind of detail but something similar is very likely happening here. Most parents like to have something to pass on to their kids or the grandchildren but we live in a time when more and more of the older generation will have nothing to pass on to help their family have just a bit of wealth. It will all end in tears.

What is Better Than No Parking Signs, Cones and Gutter Clutter?

There is something somewhere in UK law which says all traffic signposts and other forms of obstruction, such as litter bins and post boxes, should be a certain distance from the edge of the road. Not in St Helena. Roads and pavements (where there are any) are even narrower now as drivers and pedestrians avoid all the 'traffic management' which is lying in the Jamestown gutters. How does a pedestrian cross the road to use some sections of pavement in Napoleon Street now it is closed off?

Many people are clearly thinking it is time to lift our minds from the gutter and strive to think some original thoughts about how to solve the Jamestown car parking problem. Here's one idea; a jack-up barge or two in James Bay!

A jack-up barge is a barge on stilts. It can be raised or lowered according to the depth of water. They come in all sizes; the jack-up barge shown in the photo is small. The barge certainly does not need to be new; it can be in the autumn of its life so long as the structure is sound. The deck can be cleared; there is no need for the machinery and deck buildings. The railings around the edge should stay! With a ramp giving access from the seafront, a barge or two of this kind would have a few uses. One would be extra parking spaces at busy times such as Christmas. Surely the fish will not mind?

When there are big social events in Jamestown - St Helena's

Job Done - The Side Path Concrete Top is Complete



The end of the line; the contract for rebuilding Side Path and finishing it off with a concrete top ends here.

In advance of concrete laying starting, fifteen sample mixes were tried out by Isaac Construction before the mix with the best strength was decided upon. The concrete can cure sufficiently in seven days to take road traffic. While there is time now for a short break and a sandwich more work on restoration of the side wall lies ahead.

The last section of road will be covered with bitumen when the last of the preparatory work is finished. This section is part of a future phase in the Side Path and Field Road improvements which is an upgrade of the turning from Side Path into Field Road.



From Ascension Island

Legal Fight Follows Wideawake Repair Contract

Schuyler Line Navigation is the US Company is that won the contract to ship stone from Newfoundland on Canada's northeast coast to Ascension for the runway repair at Wideawake. The offloading of stone from ship to shore was a contractual responsibility given to Schuyler Line and they are responsible for the safe and timely procedure for doing the job. The offloading of stone in Clarence Bay was beset with problems throughout. Extensive delays were common. These delays are seen by many as a main reason why the cost of the runway repair spiralled out of control.



Last week it was reported Schuyler Line are suing the main contractor the Flour Corporation, another US company, for £1.8 million in detention and demurrage charges; they are blaming Flour Corporation for the cost of delays. Schuyler Line is claiming its ships were held up five times for more than a month in total due to Fluor's delays.

Eye witness accounts say it should have taken about 11 days to offload stone from a Schuyler Line ship but in practice it took as much as four times as long to complete the operation. The ship with the first delivery of stone took five months to get the stone from ship to shore. There were several occasions when no stone was transferred by barge to the pier when there was hardly any swell in Clarence Bay. The perception gained by observers on Ascension is the delays were due to failures in the methods used by Schuyler Line to offload stone rather than problems at Wideawake causing deliveries of stone not being accepted. Schuyler Line charged the Wideawake Runway Repair Project about £82,000 for each day one of their ships was in Clarence Bay. It is expected Flour will file its own lawsuit, suing Schuyler Line for avoidable or unnecessary additional costs. Schuyler Line's Wideawake contract is now finishing and it is thought they are filing their own lawsuit as they now have nothing to lose and in anticipation of legal action by the main contractor against them. The whole saga of stone delivery to Wideawake is seen as a shambles.

Ascension Residents Directly Affected by Legal Dispute

The legal fight between two US companies is also giving residents on Ascension considerable problems. As Schuyler Line withdraw from Ascension they gave local boat owners just 3 days notice they will be withdrawing the ferry service their contract obliged them to provide over the last 30 months.

The method chosen by Schuyler Line to offload stone included

a large barge located at the end of Clarence Pier which was used as an intermediary offloading point before the stone was finally deposited on land. Before the barge could be put in position all small boats moored close to the pier had to move further out in the Bay. Often this meant moving the mooring at least 100 metres further into the Bay. It was no longer possible to paddle or swim to the small boats and a ferry was required to gain access to all the local boats as small boats were previously used to ferry people to the larger boats.

With the three-day notice given by Schuyler Line of the withdrawal of the ferry service local boat owners cannot get to their boats for fishing, diving or boat maintenance until the usual mooring arrangement is reinstated. For the more energetic boat owners, swimming over 100 metres into Clarence Bay to get to a boat is not a sensible option due to the presence of sharks.


Soaring Costs

The cost of the Wideawake Runway Repair Project has increased in stages from the \$170 million first mentioned to \$281 million in March this year and now \$309 million in the latest communication. The Wideawake project is jointly funded by the UK and US governments.

Airbridge flights from Brize Norton were suspended in April 2017. Originally Wideawake was supposed to re-open in 2019-20. The latest estimated re-opening date is in the first half of next year.

Youth representatives from more than 50 states and territories gathered in Port of Spain to debate a fully prepared piece of legislation as part of a three day programme. The Youth Parliament met in the Red House, the parliament building in Trinidad and Tobago.

The CYP is seen as a key development opportunity for young people from the Commonwealth with ambitions of public office and is designed to demonstrate to potential future young parliamentarians the fundamentals behind the processes of Parliament. The CPA describes the event as a Pan-Com-

monwealth experience and a hugely valuable networking opportunity with other participants from across the Commonwealth as well as with current Members of Parliament from different jurisdictions who act as mentors throughout the week. Discovery completes scientific mission around St Helena

A Centre for Environment, Fisheries and Aquaculture Science bulletin

Royal Research Ship Discovery

From bioluminescent squid to the deployment of autonomous vessels, it has been a busy 9 days for DY159 within the St Helena Marine Protected Area (MPA).

This six-week long expedition has surveyed the marine environments of Ascension and St Helena, growing scientific understanding and conducting research in areas never previously explored.

As Discovery begins its journey to Montevideo with the remaining crew, find out below what DY159 achieved during its time in St Helena, and what comes next...

Surveying the deep



Jewel Squid under Ultra-Violet Light

At locations across the St Helena MPA, DY159 has been surveying the biodiversity present within the water column by fishing for specimens at depths between 300 and 1000 metres.

More exciting specimens have emerged during this leg of the expedition, including a jewel squid, whose light-producing organs (photophores) become clearly visible under UV light.

Many marine species of the deep ocean produce light (bioluminescence) to communicate in the pitch black, and it is used for a variety of functions – from finding a mate to ambushing prey.

Other specimens collected have included a number of species of angler fish (pictured) and a lightfish. The specimens collected will become available for analysis and study at the Natural History Museum (UK) in 2023.

Supporting sustainable fisheries management

During DY159, research has been undertaken to support the St Helena Government's sustainable fishery. Work has mainly focused on the various bait-species that local fisher's use for catching Tuna.

This began by conducting fisheries acoustics, which involves bouncing sound pings from the Discovery that reflect off shoals of bait fish, such as mackerel and bigeye scad, to determine their location. The team on DY159 then sent this location to local fishers, who then collected a sample of the bait species from each location, which were subsequently analysed by scientists on DY159.

Data from each fish was collected, including their sex and maturity, as well as length and weight. Understanding more about the life history of these bait fish species will allow the St Helena Government's Marine Section to better understand population trends and help to ensure sustainable quotas are put forward.

Autonomous vessel completes mission

Autonaut, an Uncrewed Surface Vehicle (USV), was trialled around St Helena. This autonomous vehicle was brought along to test its feasibility for the UKOTs as a data gathering tool. During its deployment, the Autonaut collected fisheries acoustics data, as well as other information such as water temperature and oxygen content.

It was given a pre-determined route to complete over 3 days, before being collected back onto Discovery. The data will now be analysed, as well as a review into the practicalities of using autonomous vehicles within the context of the Overseas Territories.

Sharing the specimens and findings with the local community

After an exciting period of scientific deployments around the St Helena MPA, DY159 returned to Jamestown on 4th December.

Before returning home, the scientific crew presented some of the amazing specimens collected during the expedition to the St Helena Government Marine Section.



St Helena Parliamentary Group has New Chair and More Members

After being appointed the Minister for Development under the new Prime Minister on 25th October, Andrew Mitchell had to resign as Chair of the St Helena All Party Parliamentary Group (APPG). The latest edition of the regularly updated APPG Register was published on 30th November showing the Rt Hon Amanda Milling MP, previously Minister with Responsibility for the Overseas Territories, was elected as the new Chair. Four other MPs and Lords joined as new members. The previous group members all remained with the St Helena APPG apart from Lord Jones of Cheltenham who died recently. Nigel Jones was a longstanding and stalwart supporter of St Helena's interests in the Palace of Westminster.

Also involved with the St Helena APPG is St Helena's epresentative in the UK, Kedell Worboys. Kedell is the 'Public Enquiry Point' for the St Helena APPG. She can be contacted by email at shgukrep@sthelenagov.com. or by phone on number 020 3818 7610.

In order to use the title All-Party Parliamentary Group, a Group must be open to all Members of both Houses, regardless of party affiliation, and must satisfy the rules agreed for All Party Parliamentary Groups. All APPGs are governed by a set of rules which set minimum standards and processes for election of officials, conducting and recording meetings, any financial aspects, contact points and non-parliamentary interests. APPGs consists of Members who join together to pursue a particular topic or interest. The St Helena APPG members have, in the past, provided strong and vocal support for the proposal to build an airport and raised questions in Parliament the UK Government's stance on issues and topics which are important to people in St Helena. The MPs and Lords who are members of the St Helena APPG promote St Helena on the main issues affecting the Island but do not get involved in the more personal issues which Legislative Councillors take up on behalf of constituents.

The New Chair - Amanda Milling MP



While a minister at the FCDO with responsibility for Asia and the Middle East Amanda Milling was also responsible for the

Overseas Territories. She held this post for seven months to 7^{th} September this year.

Chief Minister Julie Thomas said, "Having worked with Amanda Milling when she was a Minister, I am impressed with the passion she holds for the Overseas Territories family, and the deep interest she has in seeing our Island and community prosper. I look forward to meeting all new members of the group when I am next in London on business. When in the UK last month I was fortunate to meet with existing members of the APPG, who were equally as passionate and sincere about building and maintaining relationships to ensure that our Island is always well represented and not forgotten within the UK political arena "

Lord Lancaster of Kimbolton



Lord Lancaster of Kimbolton entered the House of Lords in September 2020 after serving as Mark Lancaster MP for Milton Keynes since 2005. He has worked with Andrew Mitchell both in opposition and later in government when Andrew Mitchell was Secretary of State for International Development. He has visited St Helena and was instrumental in getting support for the airport project from his Conservative Party.

Sir Graham Brady MP

Sir Graham Brady is a central figure in the governing Conservative Party. He is chairman of the 1922 Committee which is the Conservative Party's voice for the backbenchers. The chairman of the 1922 Committee is a key post which Graham Brady has held since 2010. It is an influential position and never more so than during the recent rapid changes of prime

minister. The BBC described him as the man "whose visits to No 10 have spelled the end for the UK's most recent prime ministers." It is Brady's job to assess how unhappy the Conservative Party backbenchers are and to give a succession of prime ministers an assessment on whether they have enough support among MPs to continue as leader. Often recently the answer has been 'NO' which is just one step away from saying "it's time you resigned".

He also has an active interest in history and is Director, Trustee and Vice Chairman of the Human Trafficking Foundation. Lord Randall obviously has many interests and is very energetic; another good ally to have on our side.

- Simplifying processes by having only two types of visa: Work and/or Entry
- Separating St Helenian status to those who were born as Saints or via decent
- Providing a new Permanent Residence status for those who weren't born as Saints. They would have the same rights and privileges as those with Saint Status, but without the actual name.

As well as:

Reminding the public of Sustainable Developments proposed Fast Track service for Permanent Residency via the routes of Skills Shortage Occupation lists or High Net Worth individuals.





Discovery completes scientific mission around St Helena

These specimens will be displayed in the brand-new marine lab, which was opened earlier this year. They will also be available for researchers on St Helena and around the world.

Members of the team were also excited to present some of the findings from the expedition to the local community and school children through a series of events over the following days, answering questions about DY159 and how it has advanced our understanding of the St Helena marine environment.

What happens next?

With the expedition now concluded, all of the data collected throughout the trip – from the deep-sea camera footage to the biological specimens – will now be returned to Cefas, MMO, NHM, and other organisations where they will be further analysed and written up into scientific journals, or in response to specific advice requests from the UKOT Governments. Much of the data is also set to become freely available to other researchers.

All of the information collected will be a valuable resource for the Governments of Ascension and St Helena in their continuing work to sustainably manage and protect their marine environments.

After a successful expedition across these incredible Marine

Protected Areas, the Blue Belt Programme would like to extend our thanks to the teams from Ascension Island and St Helena Government's for their work and support onboard DY159. It was invaluable to have local experts onboard and the Programme looks forward to continuing to work together on the findings from the survey and future research.
