

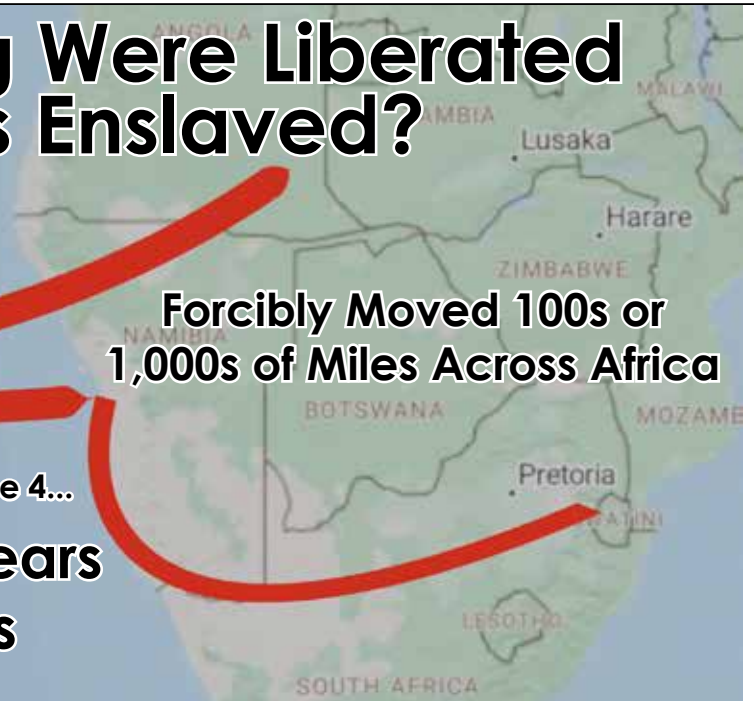

Air Accidents Investigation Report on St Helena Airport

The Biggest Outstanding Issue - Have Passengers Got a Bed for the Night?

The AAIB is the UK government authority that investigates reports of aircraft accidents and serious incidents in the UK and the Overseas Territories. Yesterday, a report was published concerning information received about an Airlink flight landing on 17th June 2023 and a similar incident on 10th September 2023. The June flight from Jo'burg encountered wind conditions necessitating two go-arounds and landing on the 3rd attempt. The September flight was from Ascension when it had to go-around four times due to turbulence before it could land.

Investigation as much about Wideawake as St Helena

The AAIB reviewed the events, but did not consider they met the definition of a serious incident. Other related issues were investigated further, resulting in six recommendations for safety improvement. Four of the recommendations concern Wideawake Airfield and the need for the RAF, UK Ministry of Defence (Cyber and Specialist Operations Command) and the Department for Transport to become fully aware of the UK-US Wideawake Airfield Agreement 2023; particularly about flights to/from St Helena diverting to Wideawake when situations require it.

The Wideawake Agreement limits the number of civil movements each week to four, which includes any take off or landing. That is, two civilian aircraft arriving and departing in any one week. Aircraft nominating the airfield as a diversion did not count towards this total, unless they actually diverted there. The number of movements is also open to periodic review, should it be needed.

The AAIB state that despite this inter-governmental agreement the RAF Operations Centre would not accept any civilian flights covered by the agreement nominating Wideawake Airfield as a diversion, although they stated they would accept such flights, where possible, in an emergency. The reasons given by the RAF was the limited ground handling resources available to service flights, especially should more than one flight arrive at any one time. The RAF also pointed to a lack of available accommodation for passengers should an aircraft be required to stay overnight.

We immediately consider the need for a diversion usually arises because something unusual has happened to the plane or on the plane. Apart from a possibly endless discussion between pilot and airport control about whether the unusual occurrence amounts to an emergency or not, the importance of a comfortable bed for the night drops right down the list of priorities for passengers in flight when the best thing that can happen is to be down on the ground.

At first sight, putting Wideawake with the Cyber and Specialist Operations Command is a bad fit. It's a bit like having the Duke of Edinburgh Playground under the Education Department; it will always be bottom of the list and get the least attention.

The Other Recommendations

One recommendation involved the airplane manufacturer, Embraer, and refining the guidance they give to operators using St Helena Airport.

For HLE it's Marker Boards

One recommendation directly and solely concerns St Helena Airport and the Touchdown Zone markings. The standard touchdown markings consist of a series of paired stripes, one either side of the centreline, spaced at intervals down the runway at set distances. At St Helena, the first set of stripes begin 150m from the threshold, with three further sets of stripes spaced at 150m intervals. This is the same for both runway directions and, due to the relatively short length of the runway, meant that the final set of stripes when landing in either direction was only approximately 300m away from the adjacent set of stripes for the opposite runway. This could potentially lead to a pilot misinterpreting how far down the runway the aircraft was when touching down.



The AAIB recommendation is for the installation of runway distance marker boards and the airport's Aeronautical Information Publication to include a warning of the potential for pilots to mis-interpret their position on the runway due to the short distance between reciprocal Touchdown Zone markings. This recommendation was adopted and the marker boards have been installed.

New Study Traces the African Origins of St Helena's Liberated Africans

A groundbreaking international study has provided new insights into the origins of the liberated Africans brought to St Helena during the final decades of the transatlantic slave trade, revealing the extraordinary diversity of their homelands and the journeys many endured before reaching the island.

Published this week in the journal *Science*, the study, undertaken by an international team of researchers in collaboration with St Helena, examined the remains of 152 liberated Africans whose graves were uncovered during archaeological excavations in Rupert's Valley in 2007–2008. The study combined historical records, chemical analysis of teeth, geographic modelling and ancient DNA to investigate where these individuals may have spent their childhoods.

The findings suggest that many originated from western Central Africa, including regions associated with present-day Angola and the Congo. However, the researchers also identified individuals whose chemical signatures point to origins much further inland, indicating that some people may have been forcibly moved hundreds or even thousands of kilometres before arriving at coastal slave-trading ports. Between 1840 and 1863, nearly 27,000 Africans rescued from illegal slave ships by the British Royal Navy were landed on St Helena. Around 8,000 died shortly after arrival and were buried on the island. The remains of the 152 disinterred liberated Africans lay undisturbed until construction began in Rupert's valley.

The researchers analysed strontium isotope signatures preserved in dental enamel. Tooth enamel forms during childhood and does not change later in life, it retains a chemical record of the environment in which a person grew up. By comparing these signatures with geological data from across Africa, the team was able to identify regions that most closely matched each individual's likely place of origin. Lead researcher Professor Hannes Schroeder of the University of Copenhagen said historical records often reveal the ports from which slave ships departed but provide little information about where captive people came from before reaching the coast. "By combining different lines of evidence and working closely with the community on St Helena, we were able to recover fragments of these life histories, including where people came from and when they were displaced."

One of the most significant findings was evidence that displacement often began long before people boarded slave ships. By analysing teeth formed at different stages of childhood, researchers found signs that some individuals had moved between distinct regions while still young, suggesting that forced relocation may have started years before their attempted transportation across the Atlantic.

For St Helena, the study represents another important chapter in efforts to better understand and commemorate the lives of the liberated Africans. The research was conducted in collaboration with the Liberated African Advisory Committee (LAAC) and the St Helena National Trust. The findings build on years of community engagement, archaeological investigation and scientific research aimed at restoring knowledge of the people buried in Rupert's Valley.

Helena Bennett, Director of the St Helena National Trust, Chair of the LAAC and a co-author of the study, said the findings highlight the diversity of the liberated Africans and the importance of recognising them as individuals rather than a single group. "This project has always been about more than scientific analysis," she said. "It is about restoring dignity and acknowledging the lives of those who suffered."

For many on St Helena, the study offers another opportunity to reflect on the island's unique role in the final years of the slave trade and to honour the thousands of liberated Africans whose stories remain an integral part of its history.

International Paramedics Day

For St Helena, this reflects the way the ambulance service and the paramedics work together as part of the island's wider urgent, emergency and pre-hospital healthcare system. In St Helena, paramedics also work alongside nurses and doctors in the Emergency Department and support outpatient triage clinics. While this differs from many larger healthcare systems, it helps make effective use of clinical skills, supports hospital flow, improves access to urgent assessment, and contributes to a more sustainable service for the community.

Innovation on St Helena is often practical and focused on local need. The Ambulance Service uses innovative digital tools such as GoodSAM and what3words to support accurate location finding, improve emergency response, and help reach patients who need urgent care.

Mansiel Falqueza Receives Bronze Award — for Volunteering

Mansiel Falqueza, St Helena's current Chevening Scholar, received a Bronze Award at the Chevening Volunteer Awards on 15 June 2026 at the Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office. The ceremony recognised scholars who have made meaningful contributions through volunteering during their studies in the UK.

Since beginning a Nursing degree at Coventry University in September, Mansiel has completed 54 hours of volunteering. Much of this was with The People's Patch in Coventry, a Groundwork West Midlands community project focused on environmental development and sustainable spaces. Volunteering three to four hours each Sunday, Mansiel supported community walks, gardening, and environmental activities, helping transform an abandoned site into an eco-friendly, accessible space.

World's Most Remote Parkrun

Parkrun is free. It's a weekly event and people of all ages are welcome to take part. To participate, all you need to do is be at the Viewing Platform at Plantation Forest by 8am on any Saturday morning.

The word is Participate – not compete – in the timed 5km (3 miles) walk, jog or run. Take your pick. You can also volunteer as a helper, if you wish.

The first Plantation Forest Parkrun was last Saturday, and it's every Saturday from now on. You can have your run, jog or walk time to complete the 5km officially recorded if you visit <https://www.parkrun.org.uk/register>. Select Plantation Forest parkrun from the list and enter your details. When registering you will be given a barcode which you will need to either print or display on a smartphone or smartwatch. The St Helena parkrun is officially registered with both Parkrun UK and the National Sports Association of St Helena (NSASH).

The minimum age of four years and children under 11 years must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

Twelve years ago, an Island politician on a formal visit to Westminster walked out of a House of Lords reception because they didn't have any beer. Instead, he found something much better, much warmer, and far more transformative: Leamington parkrun number 168.

That politician was then the Honourable Gavin Ellick better known to everyone as Eddie Duff a member of the Legislative Council here in St Helena.

Visiting the UK in 2014 from St Helena and one the most isolated parliaments in the world, Eddie was tasked with finding ways to inject physical activity into an island community with a rich sporting tradition. At Leamington, Eddie fell in love with the parkrun ethos. "It's the first time I've seen anything like that," he recalled at the time. "I was quite impressed. How people could just show up to run, how easy the organisers make it look. It was fantastic."

NHS to reward people who walk 30 minutes a day

In the UK there are 920 locations to choose from to enter a Parkrun. More than 4 million people have done exactly that and about 500,000 have got involved as volunteer helpers. That's not enough for the NHS, they want to reward people who walk 30 minutes a day.

Early next year, NHS England will launch a "marathon a month" challenge, asking people to walk for around 30 minutes a day.

Those who do it every day will hit roughly 26 miles a month - the distance of a marathon. Users will be able to log their walks online, or through their phone or smartwatch.

And the NHS says those who complete the challenge will then be eligible for rewards - which could include incentives and discounts. The NHS is covering the initial set-up, but the wider plan is to draw in philanthropic backing from major corporates as the scheme rolls out.

The scheme is being developed in partnership with Olympic medallist Sir Brendan Foster, founder of the Great North Run, who was asked by NHS England to set up a campaign to get people walking. "The ambition here is simple. We just want people to walk. Simple," he said. Physical inactivity is associated with one in six deaths, according to NHS England. A person is classified as physically inactive if they do less than 30 minutes of moderate-intensity equivalent physical activity per week. A survey by Sport England showed that in the year to November 2025 nearly a quarter of adults, or around 12 million people, were in that category.

Postponement of Non-Urgent Surgical Procedures

A small number of non-urgent operations at Jamestown Hospital have been postponed over the past two weeks due to an unexpected technical issue affecting essential theatre equipment.

SHG would like to reassure the community that emergency and urgent surgery will continue to be provided safely.

The postponements are the result of technical faults affecting the Hospital's anaesthetic machines. Despite extensive efforts by local staff working remotely with the manufacturer, the faults cannot be resolved on island. The Hospital can still provide safe anaesthesia using alternative equipment, but this is a more complex and time-consuming process and is therefore being reserved for essential and urgent procedures.

As a result, non-urgent surgery will continue to be postponed until replacement anaesthetic machines arrive on the island. These machines have already been purchased and are expected to arrive on the next scheduled visit of the MV Karoline, due on 24 July. Unfortunately, these specialist items cannot be transported by air.

Border Control Scrapped Between Gibraltar and Spain

After 118 years and several periods of dispute, including a 13-year blockade imposed by Spain, a historic post-Brexit agreement means land checkpoints between the British Territory of Gibraltar and Spain were removed on Wednesday. Freedom of movement allows seamless daily crossings without routine ID checks. Border controls have shifted exclusively to Gibraltar's airport and port, where travellers arriving from outside the Schengen zone must show passports.

The removal of the 118-year-old land border fence and checkpoint means commuters, tourists, and residents can move freely across the frontier. However, flying into Gibraltar and arrivals by sea, still need to adhere to the usual entry rules, including biometric passport verification and the 90-day stay limit.

The fifteen thousand or so Spaniards who work in Gibraltar are now released from the daily checks as they arrive and leave. Unemployment in La Línea de la Concepción and the nearby area, just across the border in Spain, is close to 30% while Gibraltar has one of the highest per capita incomes in the world. The removal of border control is expected to have major economic benefits, facilitating the flow of people back and forth, and possibly going some way to redress the imbalance between the two territories.

"This is something historic, we've had a border fence since 1908," says Juan Franco, the mayor of La Línea de la Concepción. "An average company in this town gains a third of its income from local Spaniards who work in Gibraltar,"

Wharf Cranes Defective

St Helena Government wishes to advise port users and the wider public that both cranes at Jamestown Wharf have been taken out of service following a comprehensive inspection that identified mechanical defects and safety concerns.

This precautionary measure has been taken to ensure the safety of employees, customers, and members of the public.

Investigations are currently underway to assess the full extent of the faults and determine the repairs required. As replacement parts may need to be sourced from overseas suppliers, it is not yet possible to provide a timeframe for the restoration of lifting operations at the wharf.

The crane at Rupert's Jetty remains operational and is able to provide limited lifting capability within that area. However, to ensure safe operations, the jetty must remain clear of vessels, equipment, and other items while cargo handling activities are taking place.

The St Helena Government apologises for any inconvenience this temporary suspension may cause and appreciates the public's understanding and cooperation. Further updates will be provided as more information becomes available and progress is made towards restoring the service

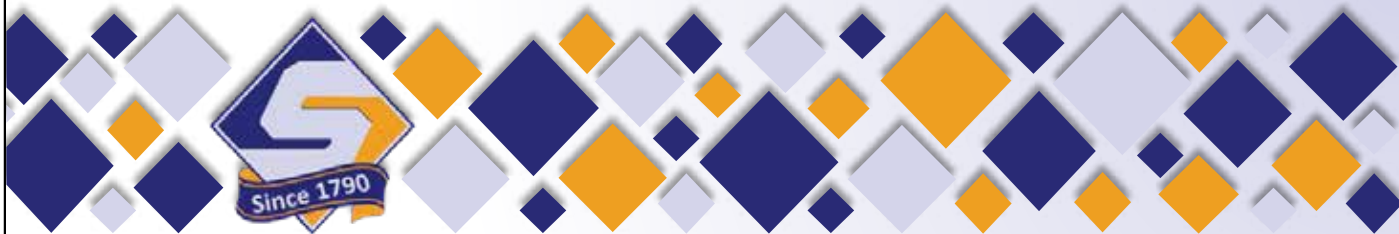
